



WILLIE GARFIELD WILSON The field...MARTIAL ARTS.

Mr. Wilson was born on August 17, 1949 in Blount County, TN where he graduated from Everett High School in the Blount County school system.

- He is married to wife, Linda (46years); they have three children...Shelia, Anston, and Shantala.
- He served three years in the U.S. Army; honorable discharge with rank of sergeant.
- He is a graduate of the University of Tennessee, B. S. Business Administration; Walter State Business College and Associate Degree from Knoxville Business College.
- Retired Postmaster from U.S. Postal Service in 2004.

Mr. Wilson is the first African American to achieve the level of MARTIAL ARTS GRANDMASTER in the Knoxville/East Tennessee area. His first exposure to martial arts was in the army. In 1973, he started his formal Okinawan Style Isshinryu Karate training in Knoxville under Grandmaster Harold Long (1992 Knoxville Sports Hall of Fame inductee).

Master Wilson is a cross-trained martial artist. He holds the following ranks: Ju Dan (10th) Degree Black Belt in SANUCES RYU, Kud Dan (9th) Degree Black Belt in ISSHIN-RYU; 4th Degree in VEE-JITSU;; 1st Degree in MILITARY ARNIS; and Certified Instructor in MODERN ARNIS.

- Master Wilson is one of the original founders of the Karate Five Association, Knoxville, TN.
- He presently serves as President of Karate Five.
- He is the chief Sensei with daily oversight over the training of the students at the Dojo (karate school).
- Karate Five Dojo was originally formed in 1974 with the blessings and encouragement of Master Harold Long to promote and teach Isshinryu Karate to the inner city youth of Knoxville, Tennessee.
- The organization was formally formed as the Karate Five Association in 1980.

The Karate Five Dojo is located in a community center. The Dojo doors are open to all that are willing to be a part of a program that is not only physical but also teaches hard work, honor, loyalty, discipline, and commitment. Over the years, Chief Instructor Master Wilson trained several hundred men and women. He has been and is influential in directing many of the youth away from the harmful ways of the streets. He also played a big part in the lives of many young

men and women in the community. Some have continued their education in the engineering and science fields. Some have grown to be government, private sector, and church leaders. He had the privilege to train legends like pro footballers, Reggie White (now deceased) and Willie Gault.

Master Wilson gave numerous martial arts demonstrations and seminars to civic groups, churches, schools...including the University of Tennessee, Black History Month activities, Dogwood Arts Festival, Knoxville College, Isshinryu Hall of Fame (IHOF), World Union Hall of Fame, and Local Radio and TV Shows. He's also conducted seminars at other local and out-of-state martial arts dojos.

Master Wilson was instrumental in organizing KIDS DAY, BACK TO SCHOOL DAY programs, and the Karate Five CONTINUING EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP. Through Kids Day, Master Wilson helped children from different schools learn about martial arts and the danger of crime on the streets. His efforts were recently recognized by Knoxville's Phi Beta Sigma fraternity. In partnership with Greater Mount Olive Moriah Church, Master Wilson was awarded the *Mentor Father Anajali Award*.

Master Wilson has excelled as a teacher/instructor/coach during his Martial Arts career. Recognized for his hard work and contributions in and outside the martial arts community, Grandmaster Wilson has been awarded the following by his peers:
